

## The business owner of a restaurant is obligated to draw up a plan to prevent the spread of coronavirus disease among customers.

*This plan template has been drawn up in accordance with the Government Decree on temporarily restricting the operations of restaurants to prevent the spread of an infectious disease, issued under section 58 (a) of the Communicable Diseases Act. Section 3 of the Decree on the placement of customers and maintaining a sufficient distance between customers does not apply to personnel restaurants or selling food or beverages for consumption elsewhere. These premises will be subsequently referred to as restaurants. The plan template does not replace the restaurant's other self-supervision plans.*

### 1. Opening and serving hours

##### **SERVING HOURS**

All restaurants - serving alcohol permitted 7:00\* - 22:00\*\*

##### **Other regions**

All restaurants - serving alcohol permitted 7:00\* - 24:00\*\*

\*Serving alcohol may begin at 7:00 if the licensing authority has granted permission for it (extended time permit) Otherwise serving alcohol may begin at 9:00 (Alcohol Act sections 43 and 44:)

\*\* Consumption of alcoholic beverages that have been served is permitted for one hour after the end of serving hours

##### **OPENING HOURS**

**Uusimaa, Kanta-Häme, Päijät-Häme, Kymenlaakso, North Ostrobothnia, Southwest Finland, Åland**

All restaurants allowed to be open 05:00 - 23:00\*

\*The restaurant must be closed to customers for one hour starting at 23:00.

**Pirkanmaa, Ostrobothnia, Satakunta, South Karelia, Central Finland, South Ostrobothnia, Central Ostrobothnia, Kainuu, Lapland, North Karelia, Hospital District of South Savo**

Restaurants whose main activity is serving alcohol may be open 24:00 - 23:00\*

\*The restaurant must be closed to customers for one hour starting at 23:00.

Other restaurants may be open for business 01:00 - 24:00\*

\*the restaurant must be closed to customers for one hour starting at 24:00.

##### **Other regions**

Restaurants whose main activity is serving alcohol may be open 02:00 - 01:00\*

\*the restaurant must be closed to customers for one hour starting at 01:00.

Other restaurants: no restrictions on opening hours

Please note: Consumption of alcoholic beverages that have been served is permitted for one hour after the end of serving hours (Alcohol act section 43)

Restrictions on opening hours do not apply to restaurants on water vessels, or aircraft operating between Finland and foreign countries, or to restaurants operating in connection with a fuel filling station.

## **2. General obligations of the restaurant**

**The restaurant must inform its customers in a clearly visible way that a person with symptoms matching coronavirus infection may not enter the restaurant.**

*Restaurant policy and instructions for customers:*

**The restaurant must ensure that:**

1. Customers have a clearly visible possibility to wash or disinfect their hands when arriving at the restaurant;

2. Furniture, dishes, cutlery and other customer contact surfaces and objects are kept clean so that they do not create a risk of spreading the infectious disease;

3. Customers are provided with instructions on maintaining a safe distance to others and on other measures to prevent the spread of the infectious disease in the restaurant.

### 3. Placing customers and maintaining sufficient distance between customers

All restaurant customers must have their own seat at a table or a similar surface. The restrictions on opening hours, the number of customer seats, the placement of customers and maintaining a sufficient distance between customers do not apply to personnel restaurants or selling food or beverages for consumption elsewhere. However, other requirements of the Communicable Diseases Act and the Decree issued under it must be followed.

Restaurants must organise the structures and furniture of their indoor and outdoor facilities and determine customer service practices to ensure that customers are not exposed to the infectious disease.
